As a server at various restaurants in various places that I have lived, I had to master various technology tablets, computer POS systems, and portable payment processors to take orders, monitor order progress, and assist customers in paying for their meal. I also used these programs to declare my cash tips.

I managed and bartended a diner in Austin, Texas for about six months. As a manager, I had to manage Yelp and Open Table reservations, along with using their associated systems to seat customers. While bartending, I had to master beer tap technology and replace kegs.

I managed a coffee shop in Flagstaff, Arizona for two years. This service industry job had Toast for ringing up orders, keeping track of customers' rewards, and I also had to master the espresso machine. When I moved to Las Vegas, I also worked at a coffee shop for about six months that also used Toast, but it used a semi-automatic espresso machine which added another level of tech to the job. Additionally, when managing, I had to place orders through Sam's Club on the app.

TFA has had countless required meetings and assignments, all conducted online except for our summer practicum and a brief two days that we all finally met each other in person. Especially our pre-work, this was probably put in place to accommodate the fact that we all would be moving to Las Vegas from different places across the country.

We have required New Teacher online classes through the school district and various professional development courses, many options of which are online.

My school placement has various required online tools such as Canvas and Infinite Campus that I had to become proficient with. I have to use these programs as they monitor student progress, behavior concerns, and are how we post student grades.

I have used Ticketmaster to get tickets for many concerts, but was one of the individuals who waited in the queue for a very long time without tickets in 2023.

I noticed as I got older that traffic signals have really advanced. Especially in the west, things like pedestrian crossings and school zones have flashing lights along with signage.

Cars and public transportation methods have really advanced since I was young. Tesla cars especially with the big doors that open look like something from a super hero movie. I grew up in a community of excessive poverty, so tech like that just wasn't something I saw or ever thought I would see in my lifetime.
